For the Week Beginning March 31, 2019—4th Sunday in Lent



“Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.” *Luke 23:42*

This verse, our Scripture of the month, appears in the story of Jesus' crucifixion. Jesus is crucified as a criminal with two other treasonous criminals. Those crucified with Jesus seem to sense that he is different. One heckles Jesus, insisting that Jesus save all three of them. The other rebukes the first man, telling him that of the three only Jesus did not deserve to be executed. He then turns to Jesus and says this: “Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.”

When hearing this story, many of us are quick to condemn the first man. We see him as selfish and self-concerned. We consider that he has completely missed the importance of who Jesus is and the power that Jesus has. We then turn toward the second man. He is the one with whom many people of faith identify. He seems at least to understand that Jesus has a special relationship with God. Still, while at first glance he may seem to be a more charitable request of Jesus, it is no less self-concerned than the first. While he indicates humility for his actions, he still seeks Jesus' favor. Both men ask Jesus to act on their behalf.

Jesus does not condemn either man for their self-concerned requests. Rather, he responds, “Truly, I tell you today you will be with me in Paradise.” The difference in the men's requests is the size of the lens with which each man looks at life. The first man considers only his physical life – the life that he has known. His lens is narrow. The second man's lens is wider, as he considers life beyond what he has known. Jesus' response widens the lens even farther: Not only will Jesus remember them (with favor), but they will be in the presence of God together.

When we are honest, we as people of faith can relate to both of these requests. At times, we ask Jesus to provide for our physical life without considering the bigger picture and the ramifications that may result from Him answering our prayers. We may ask for things that seem good for us at the time, but those same things may harm others or the environment in the end. We may pray for and benefit from a close parking spot, only to realize that the person struggling to walk behind us might have benefited more profoundly from parking in the same close parking spot. This type of prayer asks Jesus to act on our behalf, focusing in only on our personal needs.

Sometimes we are successful at widening the lens and asking for Jesus' favor beyond what is good for us. We may pray for a new transitional housing center to be built in our neighborhood, even if it may lower property values. Although caring for homeless neighbors in this way honors them and our Christian commitment, we also receive the benefits of a neighborhood with more stable housing. Ultimately, this prayer also asks Jesus to act on our behalf and keeps the main focus on us.

Jesus' response reminds us that no matter how wide we make our lens Jesus' lens is always wider. No matter how far we move out of our comfort zone, Jesus moves even farther. And so, we too are invited into humility as we pray: Jesus, remember me in your kingdom. Even though we will never be perfect and our intentions will never be completely pure, Jesus stretches out his arms to embrace us, reminding us that we will be with him in paradise.

They recently repurposed and upcycled old choir robes to create the Lenten Banners now hanging in the Sanctuary.

Learning to knit has many benefits like relieving stress, improving concentration and memory, and can provide you an opportunity to unplug from technology and focus your energy on creating.
