For the Week Beginning May 12, 2019—Fourth Sunday in Easter



Every new local initiative or experiment that a church embarks upon implies changes and transitions to be made: *Changes* refer to what is new that we will say “hello” to. *Transitions* refer to what we will say “goodbye” to.

When we talk about *change*, we usually focus on the outcome that the change will produce, e.g., a new way of working together, a new focus of ministry, a new initiative, a new structure. But when we talk about *transition*, we don't focus on new and future outcomes but on endings. *Transition* in the church points to the endings people will have to make to leave something behind. In contrast, *change* hinges on the new reality that is coming into being. People are asked to look forward, ahead, toward the future. The opposite is true when we deal with transitions. Transition hinges on letting go of the old reality and the old identity one had before the change occurred. —*The Center for Parish Development*

As CLC and St. James covenant to do ministry together, we are embracing both changes (such as a new pastor/new worship time) and transitions (the way we did things before). Anytime we transition, letting go of an old reality and identity, we feel anxious. We may know that the transition must happen and even eagerly anticipate the changes. Still, though, transition implies a period of time that we can't be quite sure what to expect or how things will work out.

A gift for churches in transition is that our fundamental story tells us that things *will* work out. The Bible evidences God's saving work in the world over and over again. God reaches out to God's people with love, mercy, and grace. God gathers God's people with hope for the future. This is the story of the Christian people. This is the story of our congregation. God continues to be faithful. We can cast our anxieties on God (difficult as this may be!) and trust that God will bring us through.

Still, though, we cannot be sure that God's future looks like we imagine our own future. If we were creating the world, designing our path, and painting a picture of our church in the future, it may very well look different than the current reality or where God is leading us. God invites us to work together with each other and with God to change, transition, and create a new future. Often, we discover that what God has imagined far surpasses anything that we might have imagined.

More transitions and changes are yet to come. In the coming weeks, I will share more about the upcoming sabbatical (June 17-October 16) and how both I and our congregations will find rest and renewal in that time. I will share my plans for me and my plans for you, and we will both live into God's plan for us and our shared ministry. When I return, our ministry will be strengthened by this time apart. That means it will also be different than how things are now. This is more change and more transition. All of this may cause you to feel anxious.

When you feel anxious, I invite you to notice your anxiety and remember that anxiety is normal. You are reacting to change – what will be different– and transition – what we must say goodbye to. You are noticing that God is working within us, and God's work is always both exciting and unsettling. When you feel anxious, I also invite you to notice your anxiety and step away from it. Give it to God. Ask someone to pray for you. Believe that God is working in you, in our congregation, and in our shared ministry. Invite God to guide us into a new future, and to grant us peace.
