FROM THE
PASTOR'S DESK

When I was engaged to be married, a friend recommended the book *Hard Questions: 100 Essential Questions to ask before you say 'I do'*. The author points out that when we are in relationship, the life we create together is

something altogether new. It's not just 'my life' and 'your life,' but also 'our life.' Failing to recognize and tend to that third reality can lead to major difficulties. This book addresses questions about everything from "Describe the feeling you want to have when you walk into our home." to "What is our ultimate financial goal?" to questions about what you imagine for your future.

As a congregation, we also have this third reality. Each of us carries into the congregation our own stories: our experiences, our hopes and expectations, our fears, our hurts, and our joys. We may recognize that others carry these same stories into the congregation. A healthy congregation depends on the relationship that we create with each other - the third reality. This isn't simply my congregation and your congregation, but our congregation. This community is not built just on experiences and hopes for the future that you and I carry, but the experiences and hopes for the future that we carry together.

So how do we create the kind of life together that we each long for? We start by asking questions, honestly telling our stories, and listening with attentiveness and humility.

This summer, we have a new opportunity to hear some of these stories. Each week during worship, someone will share a piece of their faith story and its connection to CLC. We begin with council members, but if you're interested in sharing a piece of your story, let me know! Each time we listen deeply to another person's life in the congregation, we open the opportunity to build our life together. May we share honestly, listen with attentiveness and humility, and lean into the life together which we can only build together.

With the resignation of Karen Wilberg as the Director of Traditional Music, Jo Chiko stepped into

the role of Interim Handbell Director in January of this year. This means that Jo isn't ringing bells anymore and the choir has been left with fewer ringers than in the past. Even though the church owns 4 octaves of bells (that's 49 individual notes), we are only playing 2-octave music right now (a mere 25 notes). *We miss our other 24 bells, but we can't use them without more help.* As part of our recruiting efforts, the handbell choir has decided to hold open rehearsals in May. **Every Tuesday night (the 7th, 14th, 21st, and 28th) at 7:30**, we invite all who are interested in joining - or just curious - to observe our rehearsal as we work on our music for the June 2nd service. There are no requirements for attending one of these open rehearsals: You don't have to commit to the choir or even read music, Even rides to rehearsal can be arranged.
